In this highly interactive five-day workshop, participants dig deeper into topics that are covered in the two-day Basic Training session to gain a richer understanding of the content central to school climate improvement and the imperative to focus on this important work as a primary "driver" for student and school success, both academic and social/behavioral. In addition, participants receive information about different learning styles as well as how to facilitate training for adults. Participants will become much more knowledgeable and comfortable with restorative practices and school climate content and able to return to schools and facilitate topics introduced in Basic Restorative Practices training to colleagues and other community members.

After the successful completion of Advanced Training, participants are provided with all materials necessary for such in-school training in all of the topics covered in Basic Restorative Practices training.

- Shift from punitive consequences to restorative approaches
- Create conditions for positive, trauma-free community building
- Establish necessary systems for forming, transforming, repairing, and supporting strong relationships
- Explore restorative practices as a social/relational model, not behavioral
- Conduct circles and conferences in both prevention and intervention contexts
