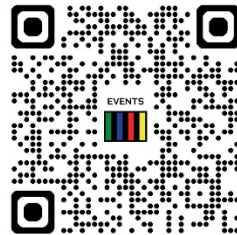
## Feeding Two Birds with One Worm: Empowering Humanities Teachers to Teach African & Latino American History While Implementing CT's New Social Studies Standards
